We emailed regional rural graduate psychology programs, developed a syllabus, and facilitated conversations with the USD psychology department faculty.

I developed and submitted the IRB application for my **Video Games and Emotions** thesis project, utilizing Qualtrics and Prolific Academic for data collection and completing cross-sectional data cleaning and assumption testing in Stata. I conducted a power analysis using MPlus, specifically utilizing Monté Carlo simulations. I performed comprehensive data analyses in R, Stata, and MPlus, covering ANOVA, MANOVA, Path models, CFA, SEM, and LMSEM. The outcomes of this project were disseminated through posters at various conferences, supported by two grants for data collection and presentation. This effort culminated in a first-author manuscript published in the *International Journal of Mental Health and Addiction*.
